On Sunday evening, January 12 Sonoma Skypark lost a wonderful friend in our family of aviation enthusiast. Doris "Jeanne" Williams died suddenly at a friend's home planning a trip to Ireland in the near future. Jeanne and her late husband Jim were fixtures in the Northern California aviation scene for more than forty years.

The Williams's were some of the first individual's that said "count me in" when we were putting the current Sonoma Skypark, Inc. structure together in 1986. Soon after that they were building their hangar. Even with their ownership here they continued to be an integral part of Schellville Airport and Jeanne was a major spark plug in the "Schellville Antique Escadrille. Jeanne served on the scholarship committees of the Escadrille and Petaluma Area Pilots Association to the present time. Jim and Jeanne did not have children but she was always a supporter of any youth oriented project and you could count on her to contribute both monetarily and physically.

Both Jeanne and Jim were accomplished pilots owning a Cessna 180, Piper J-3 Cub, Stearman bi-plane and a Fleet 2 along with Jeanne's Marquat Charger. In the 1970's they both performed at Northern California airshows with low level waivers in their bi-planes. After retiring from a long career with Seagram Spirits Jeanne took on bookkeeping accounts for various organizations and associations including the Shell Vista Volunteer Fire Department and Sonoma Skypark, Inc.

Jeanne served on the Skypark Board of Directors for a number of years including a few years as President. She was our CFO and bookkeeper until her death. I will always miss her presence and sincerity when working with her. She could be stubborn and strong willed but she still seemed to have the capacity to listen to the other point of view. Rest in peace my friend. We wish you blue skies forever.

<u>Celebration of Jeanne Williams Life</u> – On Sunday January 26th friends of Jeanne's gathered in the airport clubhouse to share memories and stories about Jeanne.
