EAA 1268 MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN AND TREASURER REPORT

August 2017

Treasurer Report – Activity in our checking account was slower than normal – probably due to the heat or possibly because a lot of our members migrated temporarily to Wisconsin to participate in the activities at AirVenture. The only activity was one deposit in July for \$182 which consisted of a donation to the Air Academy Fund, a couple dues renewals and July dinner receipts. Our checking account balance is still inflated due to an outstanding check for \$1664 to the Air Explorers that hadn't been cashed as of the July 31 statement

date and \$1000 in donations that are being held in our checking account. Subtract this \$2664 for our statement balance of \$12,482.30 and our actual balance is \$9818.30.

EAA CHAPTER 1268 MINUTES

EAA 1268 Board of Directors Meeting July 11, 2017

Members present: President Robin Tatman, Vice President Don Booker, Treasurer Bill Wheadon, Directors Jeanette Woods and Paul Seibert

Absent: Secretary Nelleke Cooper and Director Darrel Jones

6:25 – meeting called to order. Items discussed: Director Seibert inquired of the Treasurer the methodology for soliciting donations for our chapter educational activities and how the donors receive recognition. The treasurer replied that a cash contribution or check made out to EAA 1268 is the preferred method with, in the case of a check, an entry in the memo field denoting the preferred activity to receive the donation. This could be the Air Academy Fund, Air Explorers, or our general fund. In the case of a cash donation, a verbal request to one of the groups would be sufficient. Recognition of the donation would be in the form of a thank you letter written by the treasurer. Included in the letter is a statement indicating that EAA 1268 is recognized by the IRS as a 501c3 organization and that donations are deductible by the IRC. Director Seibert suggested that this be publicized in the newsletter by possibly having a permanent entry such as a text box with the above information.

The Treasurer gave a verbal report on the chapter finances: during the month a deposit of \$215 was made - \$100 in donations to the Air Academy and Air Explorers, \$45 in dues renewal, and \$70 in dinner receipts. One check was written to the Air Explorers for \$1714 (not yet cleared) which was held in the chapter checking account from donations and Family Fun Day receipts. The chapter checking account effective balance is \$10586.50 Vice president Booker gave his account of getting medically certified under the new Basic

Med provisions. He's anxious to get in the air again and is considering buying a Cherokee 235.

Air Explorer Advisor Robin Tatman reported not much activity with the Air Explorers. She's on a semi-sabbatical while preparing for her transition from flying the 747 to the 777. Recruiting a dinner chef/s for August was discussed.

Board of Directors meeting adjourned at 6:55.

EAA 1268 General Membership Meeting Minutes, July 11, 2017 7:40 pm

President Robin Tatman opened the meeting with a thanks to Darrel Jones for displaying his barbecuing skills by providing a meal featuring a medley of grilled tri-tips, chicken breasts & thighs and sausage. Accompanied with potato salad this made an ideal summer meal. Robin Tatman brought some homemade peach cobbler – combined with vanilla ice cream and coffee (provided by Howard Hall), it was a perfect dessert.

Guests were introduced – Margaret Bourne, a friend of Robin Tatman, and Ernie Ganas, a friend and neighbor of both Howard Hall and John Knebel. Ernie was so impressed by our organization that he signed up as a member on the spot.

A call for announcements produced a request from Jan Wheadon for more people to volunteer to be our dinner chefs. She also passed out a list of suggested dinners that were simple and easy to prepare.

Andrew Daigle, one of the Air Academy attendees that our chapter sponsored, gave thanks to our chapter and also a brief synopsis of his experience at the Air Academy. His father, Rane, also expressed his appreciation for the chapter support and gave a history of how he and Andrew became members of our chapter.

Our speaker of the evening was Richard Martin who gave an entertaining account of his recent interest in aviation and his acquisition of a C-41 aircraft which is a variant of the DC-3. Richard bought the aircraft and had it completely restored to the point of removing the wings and correcting any corrosion or discrepancies found. The engines were also removed and overhauled. His near goal is to have it available for local excursion rides. He also is planning on doing an around-the-world flight with his wife and a few friends. EAA 1268 member Bob Berwick is his pilot. Richard is also planning on getting his pilot license but the question of doing it in the C41 is doubtful – he thought starting out in a smaller airplane would be more prudent.

Good morning Darrel,

I would like to start off by expressing my gratitude for being sent to such an amazing camp. At the Air Academy, we wrote letters thanking our sponsors where I may go into more detail regarding other aspects of camp.

During the 2017 EAA Air Academy Basic Camp, we had the opportunity to make lunar landers, like last year, but this time we made rockets and learned all about forces applying to rockets, i.e. what apogees and perigees are, the point of max stress, etc. I have learned that each year we do similar activities but learn more that applies to building them, making the activities more successful and fun. We also utilized metalworking tools that are necessary to build an aircraft, or at least a metal one, and we built a metal clock. In the workshop, we also made wooden wing ribs, the wing ribs of an Acro-Sport. Since we made metal objects and wood objects we only have on real material left, composite, so we made composite airfoils. All of these creations will be brought to display at a meeting. Julien had also taken some wonderful photos which we will be making a slideshow on. In regards to Julien, we bunked together, and saw old friends and made new ones. And as always, the food was great.
