We'll talk more about this at the meeting and in future meetings. It would be nice to get this going by summer.

Membership Report Once again annual dues season is upon us. For those of you who have already paid – thank you. One of our biggest expenses (excluding our sponsorship of our Air Academy cadets) is the fee we pay to EAA national to be under their umbrella. This year it totaled \$570 and was rendered in a check we wrote in December. Not only does this give us insurance coverage in our sanctioned chapter activities but we do get a lot of assistance from the various advisors back at EAA headquarters. Our effective checking account balance (not counting funds held in the Jack Strehl Memorial Fund) now stands at \$9539.53.

Board of Directors Meeting
January 9, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:15 by President Robin Tatman. Present were Walt Eastland, Bill Wheadon, BK White, Jeanette Woods, Paul Seibert, Marsi Fahraji, and Darrel Jones.

Bill gave his annual treasurer's report with running balance, deposits, Air Academy scholarship, meal accounting and the Jack Strehl memorial fund.

BK reported on this year's Young Eagles schedule and noted that Young Eagles log books are available to each participating Young Eagle and include a link and code for free private pilot on-line ground school.

Marsi reported that the Napa EAA Chapter 167 is offering free ground school classes every Thursday from 7 to 8 p.m. at the airport office. The class is offered by Greg Murray who will

also give a free introductory ride any day after 3:30 p.m. His phone number is 707-738-5310.

Marsi also reported that Greg is trying to put together a flying club with a Piper Cherokee with ten shares selling for \$2,000 each, and a projected cost of \$50.00 per month maintenance fee.

Darrel reported that he has received one application for the 2018 Air Academy so far.

Robin reported that Richard Martin's DC-3/C-41A is scheduled to fly to Oshkosh this summer. She is looking into whether it would work to transport at least some of our Air Academy participants to camp.

Robin also reported that Air Explorer Post 1268 would meet at 11:30 after Young Eagles.

The Board of Directors meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

Dinner was provided by Roland Gangloff and consisted of lasagna, salad, garlic bread, pie and ice cream. Roland has offered to give a presentation at a future meeting about Alaskan bush pilot O. J. Smith.

The general membership meeting was called to order at 7:20 p.m. by Robin.

The program for the evening was a presentation on Truckee Tahoe Airport by Katie Greenwood and Dr. Howard Donner, rumored to be one of the survivors of the Donner party.

They gave an excellent Powerpoint presentation about how to safely fly into and out of Truckee Tahoe Airport and about the attractions available there.

At the end of the presentation Katie gave out some nice Truckee Tahoe hats for answering questions about the airport and invited everyone up for a visit. I think she said that she would buy lunch.

It was a very informative and enjoyable presentation. Katie laughed a lot and Howard smiled warmly. Robin thanked them and invited them back anytime they wished to visit again. Hopefully Howard can give a more detailed presentation on mountain flying at a future meeting.
